Parish Accounts

The Parish Accounts for 2023 will be presented on our website as soon as the Finance Committee have signed off on them. The purpose of the Finance Committee is to ensure that proper processes and procedures are followed regarding all activities related to finance and governance in the parish. This is the first time that the parish has had a Finance Committee, and it is taking a little while to grow into the role. We are grateful to the members of the committee. The parish is undergoing an audit by Mazars as is the practise for all parishes every so many years. The Finance Committee will ensure that the recommendations of the audit will be implemented. The members of the committee are Frank O'Neill, Ciaran Casey, Marion Roche, Annette Byrne and Fr. Alan Hilliard. We will shortly put the names of the Finance Committee and the Parish Pastoral Council on our website.

The money set aside for the refurbishment of the Church has accumulated interest. The amount of money placed in the diocesan account called SHARE was lodged on 17 June 2022 – the amount was EUR 1,879,013.65. Since this date €67,114.77 has been earned via interest rates and investments, of which €36,222.36 was earned in 2023. This money is on deposit and can only be used for the refurbishment of the Church. All expenditure will be overseen by the Parish Finance Committee and is subject to the audit that is currently taking place.

The post box for the parish is on the presbytery wall in the courtyard.

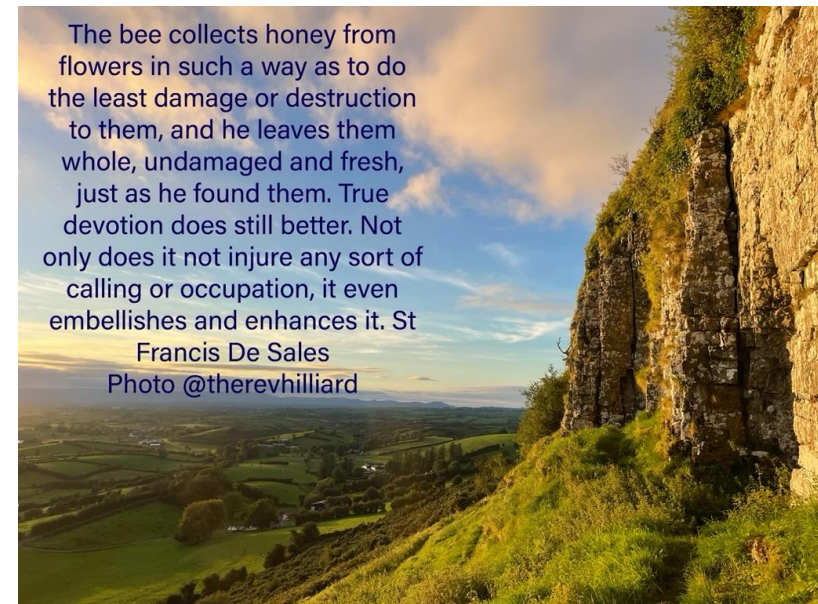
Week of the 7th of July
